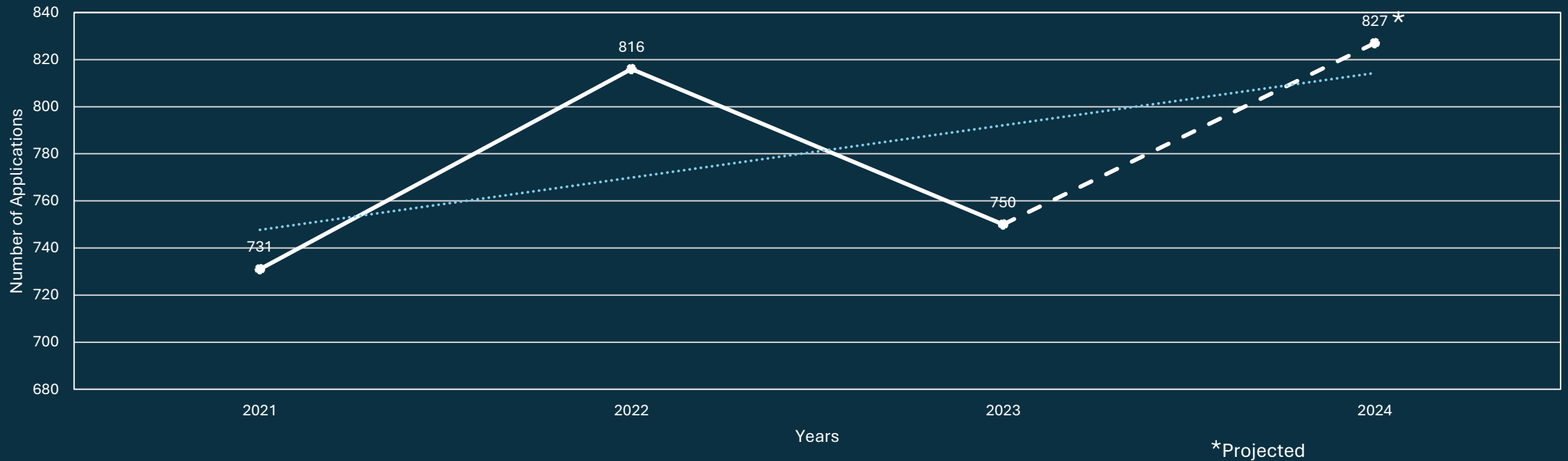


# Waiver Enrollment and CIH Applications

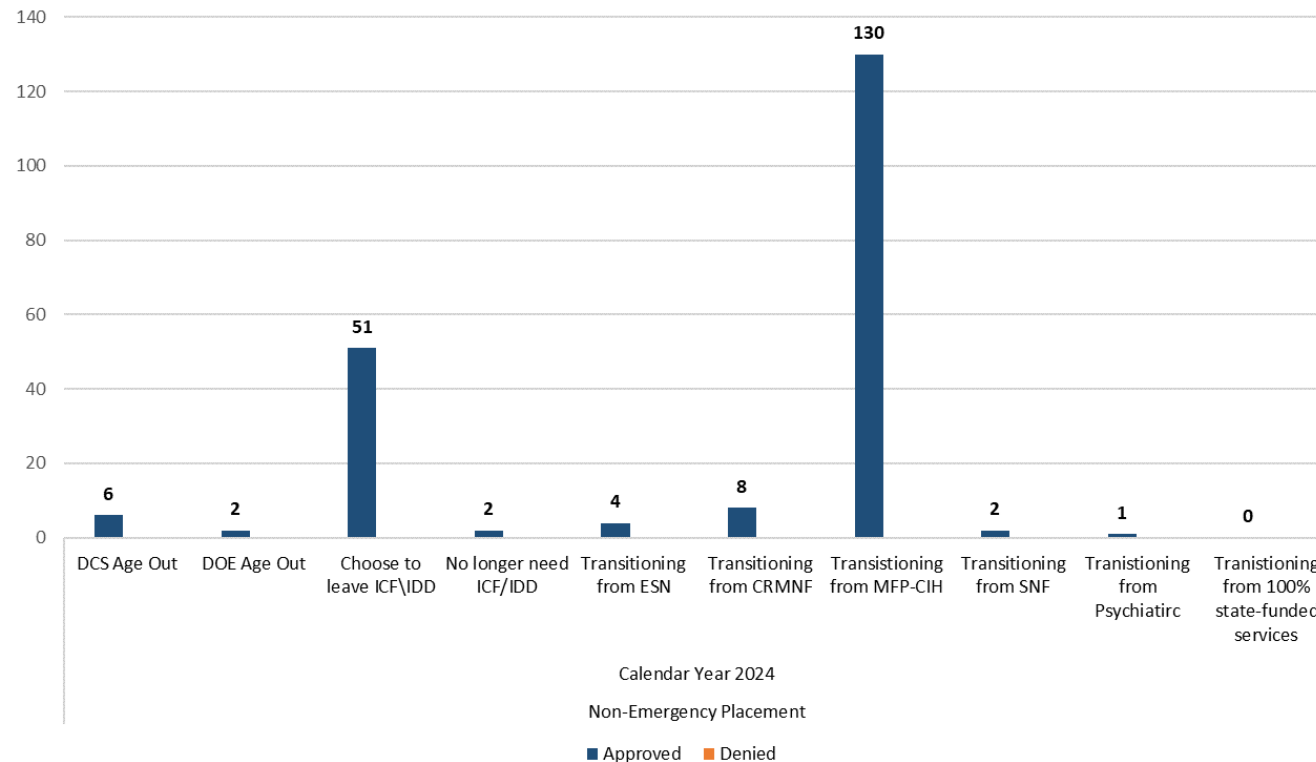

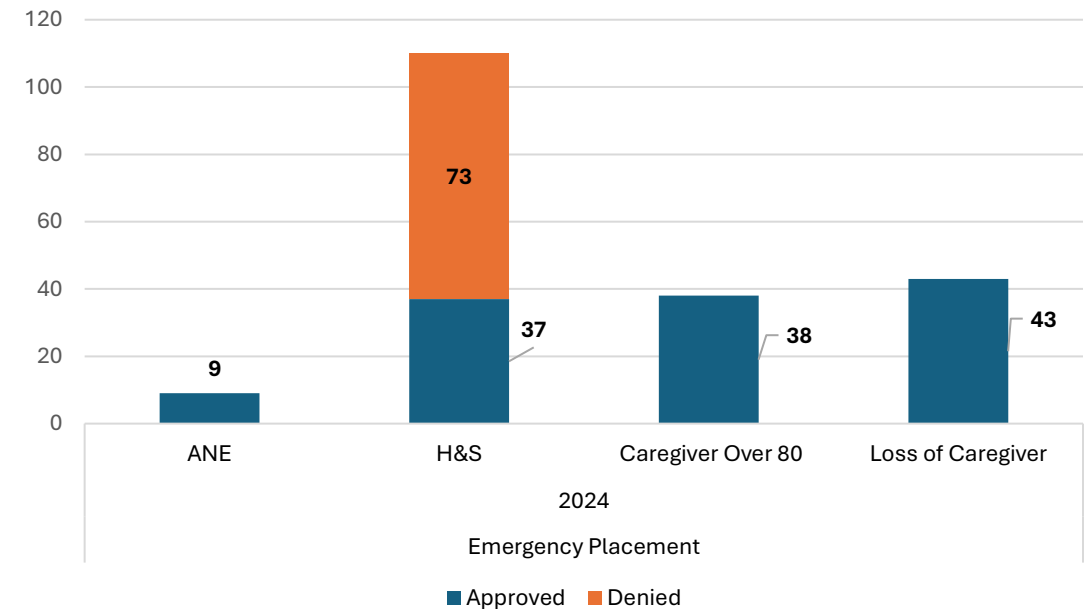
## Non-Emergency and Emergency Approvals by Category

Count of Approved vs Denied

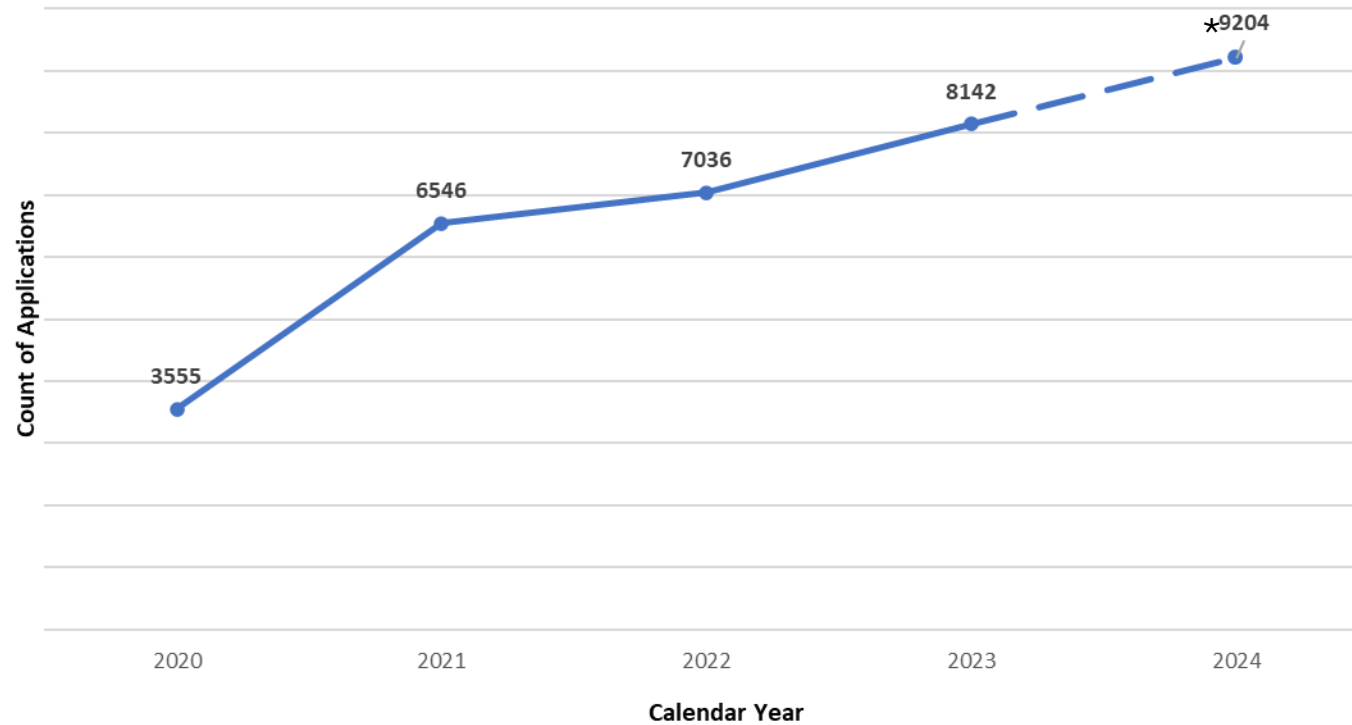


Emergency Applications with Decisions Rendered -

- We are currently inviting individuals who applied in January 2022.

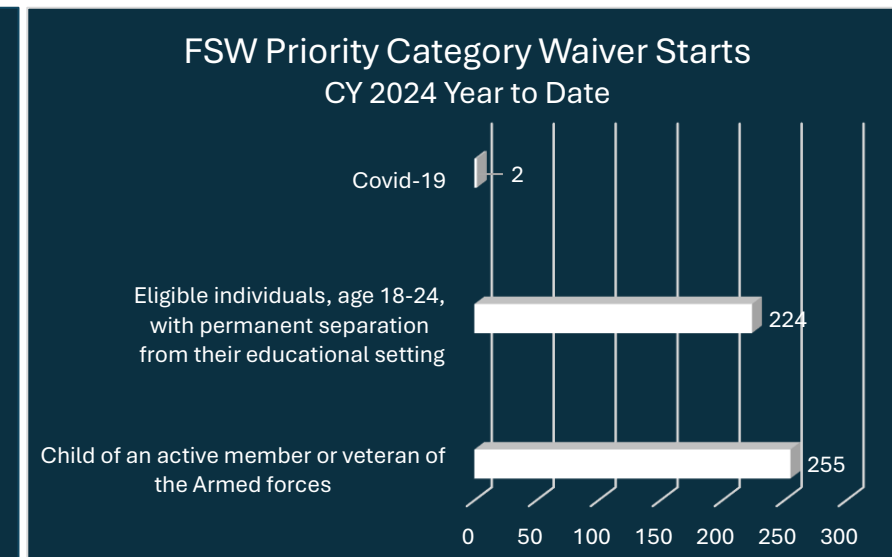
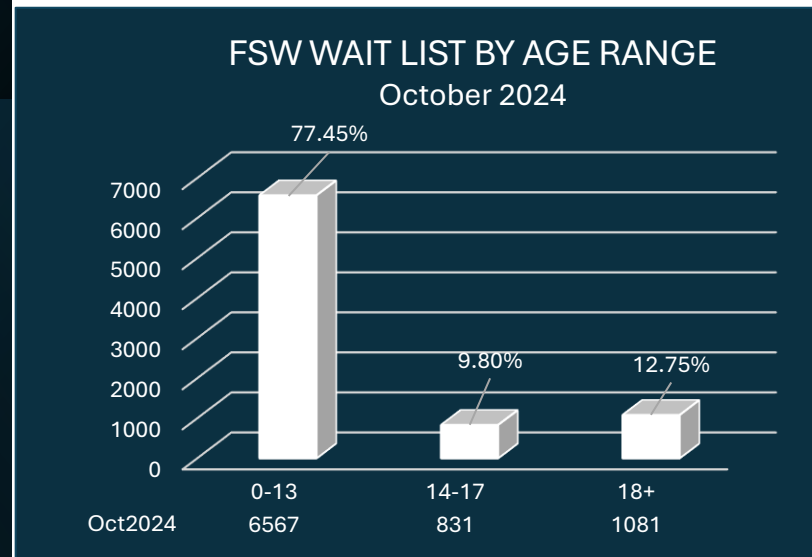

# Majority of Individuals on Family Supports Waiver Wait List are 13 and under

as of 10/8/2024

- The waitlist currently has 8,479 individuals.
- BDS applications continue to increase. In CY 2024 we anticipate receiving 9,204 applications, a 13.04% increase from 2023.
- 77.45% of individuals on the wait list are 13 years of age or younger. These same youth have access to services and supports they can access while waiting for waiver services, some of which, unlike waiver services, are entitlement services.
- Individuals who are youth ages 18-24 years, transitioning from educational services, are FSW Priority.
- Monthly invitations from the FSW waitlist increased to 200 per month in October, 2024.
- FSW Priority category waiver invitations are not included in the monthly 150 invitations
